DEAL

ST. LEONARD'S.

The old Parish Church of St. Leonard's, situated in Upper Deal, the oldest part of the town, dates from the 12th century. It was partly rebuilt in 1686 and altered. The curious cupola crowning the tower was for many years repairable by Trinity House (being a conspicuous landmark for shipping). The many hatchments and tablets inside speak of the historical associations of the Church and Parish. The Gallery, called the Pilot's Gallery, was erected to commemorate the great storm in 1703.

ST. GEORGE'S.

St. George's, the Corporation Church, built of brick, and ivy-clad, and standing close to the Town Hall, was erected in 1708. Its old Churchyard, or "Chapel Field", as it is sometimes called, is peaceful and beautiful in comparison with the hustle of the busy High Street adjoining. Beneath the spreading trees rest many heroes; men who fought with Nelson sleep in this sacred spot. Within the imposing entrance gates, erected to commemorate King Edward VII, is an impressive Celtic Cross raised to the memory of Lieutenant Arthur Walderne St. Clair Tisdall, V.C., and many other gallant heroes of the Parish of St. George's who fell during the Great War.

ST. ANDREW'S (Anglo-Catholic).

In West Street, consecrated in 1850.

THE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH

in High Street, with a history dating from the Commonwealth.

THE METHODIST CHURCH.

almost opposite St. Andrew's Church, erected in 1865.

THE BAPTIST CHURCH.

in Victoria Road, erected in 1881.

THE ROMAN CATHOLIC SANCTUARY.

St. Thomas of Canterbury, in Blenheim Road, opened in 1885.

WALMER
